# How DLA Supply Centers buy



- Original OEM
  - Cage Code and Part Number
- Qualified Products/Manufacturers lists
  - QPL's/QMLs
- Approved Sources
- Fully Competitive AMSC G only 15%
  - bid sets and drawings available

# Technical DATA Terms to Know



- C-Folders (Collaboration Folders)
- JCP Certification (2345 Form)
  - Export Control
- Foreign Secure (2018 Form)
- OEM License Agreements
  - Provides approval to use the data to bid and MFG item
  - Additional Access Required
- Drawing Software (Allows opening of drawings)
- AMSC Codes (identifies Govt Data rights)
- Document Codes (identifies type of Tech Doc)
- ASSIST (allows free access to Fed Specs and Standards)

# Why Can't I access Drawings in Dibbs



- Drawings are not available
  - Government does not own all drawings
  - Data is proprietary to Original Manufacture
- Government must announce all purchases
- Your not registered in C-Folders
- Restricted Data
  - Requires JCP Certification
- OEM owned Data is not Available
- OEM owned Data often is Available
  - Additional Access Required
  - Data requires License Agreement
- Government owns the Data
  - 15% of DLA Solicitations Gov't has approval to release tech data
- Data is available in tech Docs but not complete
- You are not an approved source



# What is C- Folders?

- DLA DIBBS Electronic File
- Contains Technical Documents Available to DLA
  - Drawings
  - Specifications
- Electronically linked to each Solicitation Number
- Requires Password separate from Dibbs
- Requires Software to open drawings
  - Google Lucent Viewer or Image viewer
- Requires approval for Access to Restricted Data
  - JCP Certification-2345 Form
  - No Foreign Secure-2018 Form
- Can Require OEM approval to use certain data

  - RFQ Search
  - Search by FSC
  - Show open RFQ's posted in last 15 Days
  - Sort by issue date
  - Show Items with Technical Documents
  - Search (green box)
  - Go to bottom of last page for most recent solicitation

# What is JCP Certification?

- The Joint Certification Program (JCP) certifies Canadian and United States (U.S.) contractors for access to unclassified military technical data belonging to Canada's Department of National Defence (DND) and to the U.S. Department of Defense (DOD).
  - Form JCP 2345
- Google Joint Certification Program web site for 2345 Form
- *No Foreign/NOFORN* Required gain access to technical data designated as such
  - No Foreign Form 2018
  - Find Form C folders under License Agreements

# What are License Agreements? (OEM Approval Documents)



- Additional Access Required
  - 01 Boeing Rights Guard
  - 02 Boeing/ McDonnell Douglas C-17
  - 03 Boeing/Hughes Helicopter M242
  - 04 Caterpillar Inc. M1112
  - 05 Colt Industries M4, M16
  - 06 Fabrique Nationale Herstal M240
  - 07 General Electric
  - 08 Karl H Hoie
  - 09 Boeing McDonnell Douglas Helicopter M242
  - 10 Lockheed C-5
  - 11 Lockheed C-141
  - .....ETC.

# What are AMSC CODES?

## (Acquisition Methods Suffix Codes)



- DOD Technical Data Classification System
- Where do I find the AMSC Code?
  - Click on the NSN
  - Subscription Services (Lamlinks, Haystack, etc)
- Can Have 2 digits
- First digit is a number (0-5)
  - 1 Part is suitable for acquisition 2<sup>nd</sup> time
  - 2 part is suitable for acquisition for the 1<sup>st</sup> time
  - 3 Part may be acquired directly from actual Mfg
  - 4 Part may be acquired for 1<sup>st</sup> time from actual Mfg
  - 5 Sole source but not from actual Mfg
- Second digit is a letter (A-Z)



# AMSC Codes

## (Definitions of Second Digit Letter)



- A- Govt right to data is questionable
- B- Data is source Controlled
- C- Contracting only from approved source
- G- Data is technically suitable and legally clear
- H- Inadequate Data
- K- Produced from Class 1 casting
- N-Requires special test
- P-Rights to use data legally unavailable
- Q-Government does not have the data
- R-Rights to use data restricted
- T-Qualified Products list
- Z- Commercial off the shelf item

# What are Document Data Codes

(Describes type of Technical Document)



- DD-Drawing
- SS- Process Specification
- CB- Process Specification
- ST -Standard
- PL- Parts List
- CN- Change Notice
- RE- Revision
- AM- Amendment
- DM- Drawing is a Mylar
- AL Application List

# Approved Sources?



- Pre approved to bid on identified/Critical Items
- Must show legal access to the Data (usually OEM)
- AMSC Code other than G
  - Original Manufacture
  - Pre approved suppliers
- Approved via Source Approval Request (SAR) Process
  - Demonstrated capability to supply the item
  - Equal to or better than the original item
- Approved via Qualified Products List
  - Requirement identified in Solicitation
  - Submit request to DLA for approval

# Source Approval Process (SAR)



- Process for becoming an Approved Source
- Ref Source Approval Handbook
  - DLA Aviation Small Business Office web site
- Supplier Submits A SAR package that demonstrates supplier can manufacture the item to the same level of quality or better than the original Equipment Manufacture, OEM.
- Cat 1 Supplier has Manufactured the item in the Past
- Cat 2 Supplier has Manufactured a similar Item
- Cat 3 Supplier has not manufactured similar items
- Approval usually based on government need



# Qualified Products Lists



- Critical Application Items
- listing of products or family of products
  - Suppliers have met Qualification Requirements
- The QPL listing is used by government activities to identify approved sources for selected items
- Submit request to DLA Contract Specialist
