Rural Economic Development Incentive (REDI) Grant

Businesses can receive \$4,000 to \$6,000 for each new high-paying job created in many rural Utah counties. These jobs can be remote, online, in a satellite hub/office space, or physically located in the same county as the business.

Eligibility

A business considering the REDI grant must apply for and receive approval through the Utah Governor's Office of Economic Opportunity (Go Utah) in advance of creating any new position, which meets the following requirements:

- Pays at least 110% of the county's average wage
- It is filled by an employee who works at least 30 hours per week or meets customary full-time industry standards
- Will exist for at least 12 consecutive months
- It does not include construction, retail, staffing or public utility industries

Incentives

A business may qualify for up to \$250,000 each fiscal year in REDI grants and concurrently apply for or receive other Go Utah incentives.

Potential Grant Amounts

\$4,000 for each new

full-time employee position in a county where the average county wage is equal to or greater than the state average wage

\$5,000 for each new

full-time employee position in a county where the average county wage is between 85% and 99% of the state average wage

\$6,000 for each new

full-time employee position in a county where the average county wage is less than 85% of the state average wage
